Duties	<p>The Music Tutor and Ensemble Director's primary role is to teach Guitar to beginner and continuing students and to direct ensembles as deemed appropriate by, and under the direction of, the Head of Co-curricular Music.</p> <p>Specifically, the successful candidate will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plan and teach individual and small group guitar lessons • Develop and implement a sequential guitar tuition program that collaborates with and complements the existing guitar program • Prepare students for solo performances, external examinations, and tertiary music auditions • Contribute to preparing students for ensemble performances • Be an active and engaged participant in the recruitment of students • Monitor, evaluate and report on student progress • Follow College procedures regarding maintaining records, following up absent students and communicating with parents • Attend co-curricular music meetings and events as required • Other tasks as deemed appropriate by the Head of Co-curricular Music or College Principal
Essential Selection Criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have completed a Bachelor of Music majoring in jazz and or contemporary Guitar performance or equivalent • Demonstrated high level of aptitude in teaching private and individual lesson in Guitar from beginner to advanced level • Demonstrated ability and willingness to contribute positively and meaningfully to a co-curricular music team • Demonstrated experience in directing ensembles • Demonstrated ability to use a wide range of teaching strategies to cater for diverse student learning needs • Demonstrated ability to motivate and engage students from beginner to advanced level • Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with colleagues to achieve positive musical outcomes for all students
